



This course meets the requirements for the Orton-Gillingham Academy Associate certification. Participants must complete the 100-hour Practicum following the coursework to be Certified at the Associate Level of the Academy of Orton-Gillingham. The practicum requires separate fees.



PRACTICUM DETAILS

The Associate level practicum includes mentorship from your Fellow as you complete a minimum of 100-hours of 1-to-1 intervention lessons with a minimum of 10 observations. The practicum must last a minimum of 8 months with most trainees completing this process within 12 months. Throughout the practicum Casey will offer guidance and support as you choose an appropriate practicum student, determine starting point of instruction through assessment data, and write and deliver diagnostic and prescriptive OG lessons. Throughout the practicum Casey will prepare you for the process of applying to the Academy for Associate credentials at the end of your practicum.
